

The Priests of the Sacred (S.C.J.), also known as Dehonians after the last name of our founder Leo John Dehon, serve in 41 countries throughout the world. We began o serve the Native Americans in the Lower Brule area in 1923, and soon afterwards began to minister those on the Cheyenne Indian Reservation. Years later, the Priests of the Sacred Heart began to also serve the Farmers and Ranchers in the region. Today, we serve six parishes in the East and West Missouri river regions. They are:

> St. Mary's in Lower Brule, St. Mary's in Reliance, St. Michael's in Kennebec, St. Joseph's in Fort Thompson, Immaculate Conception in Stephan and St. Catherine's in Big Bend.

Our other missions include St. Joseph's Native American school founded in 1927 and the Sacred Heart center on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation. The school is dedicated to improving the quality of life for Lakota and Dakota (Sioux) children and families. The Sacred

Heart Center covers over 4,707 square miles and operates four primary programs; Family Violence Services, Child Services, Community Outreach and Bear Necessities

Our ministries are also supported by the Benedictine Sisters of Watertown, SD. The sisters first came to the United States in 1864 in Missouri and then settled in the Dakota Territory in 1874 in Zell, SD. In 1889, they built their Sacred Heart Monastery in Yankton SD and then broke grown for their Mother of God Community in 1967 in Watertown, SD. The Benedictine sisters established schools, Hospitals and other services around the Dakotas,



Scripture Reflection

Have any of you seen the movie the National Treasure with Nicolas Cage? He goes and steals the Declaration of Independence to find clues to find billions of dollars of buried treasure—treasure that was buried by the Free Masons. They discover that much of this treasure is lost priceless items from 3 thousand years of world history. In the end, they share this treasure with the world.

Today's readings speak of God sharing a precious treasure for us to seek and find. The first reading speaks of Solomon wanting the treasure or gift of having an understanding heart to judge his people wisely. We are to be like Solomon. We are to hunt for the treasure of the Divine Wisdom of God. This will allow us to live a life free from the bad choices and behaviors that we live by. To have the wisdom to have a long term relationship with Jesus. Sin, light of this thought, St. Paul says that God brings good out of evil for all things. And we have been destined to live in heaven. How can we be wise? Value the things that God values. Our faith is valuable more than any pearl, diamond or gold we may find.

In the three parables in the Gospel, Jesus refers to the Kingdom of God as one who finds the precious treasure buried in a field or searching for a fine Pearl or one who collects an abundance of good fish. All of these earthly stories are to remind us of the precious gift of Christ in our lives who is the pathway to our ultimate treasure which we will find in his Kingdom in heaven.

In the time of Jesus, there were many invasions of lands. So, people would hide their money in fields. This was true of even in our modern era. Since everyone knew this, many people would sneak on a person's land and hope to find the money in order to buy land for themselves. Many owners were killed so others could claim the land and hope they would find more buried treasure there.

Of course, Jesus was not asking his audience to steal someone's money or property. He was getting people to compare the desire to find monetary treasure to that of seeking out or hunting equally for the treasure of the Kingdom of God that has greater worth and value. To use that motivation to take a risk to follow Jesus, who is the ultimate treasure to be found. Jesus is reminding us that being a Christian will demand that we must make a personal response to God and to his Kingdom. This Kingdom is mentioned some 80 times. For the Kingdom on earth is an invitation to accept and live by the values of love and generosity. For God is the ultimate treasure to be valued above all things in our daily lives. We are asked to take drastic means to obtain the Kingdom and relationship with God.

Jesus calls on us to be those men in the parables to surrender all of our emotional possessions in order to gain eternal life. Sell everything to obtain eternal life. This does not mean that we abandon our wealth or homes to live in poverty. Neither does this mean that we disobey our governmental authority.

Our treasure hunting goal is simple. Live by the commandments and teachings of God and continue to be faithful to God. Never loosing site of our goal. It is that faith that will be evaluated by God, especially when we die. If we are truly wanting to govern our own actions and personal life, before we regulate other's lives, we must live according to the values of God. God's wisdom and laws direct our lives. Worldly wisdom cannot offer this for us.

St. Augustine says that God created us without our consent or cooperation, but he will nor and cannot save us without our cooperation. This is what St. Paul is saying today. God continues to do everything and provide for us the means to bring us to heaven. We must constantly be searching for the reign of God in the fields of our hearts and in this world. We must be joyful and excited about finding it and then sharing it. The Kingdom is found when we try to meet the needs of our neighbors. When we check on elderly neighbors in hot weather. Visit shut ins. Treat others with love and dignity. (Fr. Mark Mastin, SCJ)
